PROPOSED TREE WORKS:

Works to various trees.

I refer to your recent notice of intention to undertake works to tree(s) within a Conservation Area.

I can confirm that consent has been granted for the following works:

- T1 Pine. Prune lowest secondary branches (crown lift) to achieve 5.5 metres clearance from ground level to facilitate passage of high sided vehicles. Reduce lowest over extended canopy spread to the south by 3 metres to blend in with upper crown. Remove dead wood.
- T2 Western Red Cedar Prune lowest branches (crown lift) to achieve 3 metres clearance from ground level. Remove large diameter drooping lower limb. Remove dead wood and split branches in upper canopy. Cut back to fence line.
- T3 & 4 Holly Prune lowest branches (crown lift) to achieve 2.5 metres clearance from ground level. Reduce height by 3 to 4 metres.

T5 - Holly – Remove and replace with fruiting tree. Tree in poor condition.

T6 - Holly - Crown lift 5 metres to clear highway. Height reduction by 3 to 4 metres.

T7 - Apple tree - Formative prune cut back from property and highway. Remove small separate tree growing from base.

T8 - Lilac - Remove and replace with fruiting tree.

In order to comply with the statutory requirements laid down in Section 214 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 the intended works will be entered onto the Council's public register of intended tree works within Conservation Areas for the required six weeks.

This six weeks notice period commenced with the receipt of your notice by this office and will expire on 11-Jul-2022. After this date you will be able to commence the above tree works.

The above authorization lasts for two years from the date of this letter. If the intended works are not undertaken within this time you are required to re-notify us in writing.


Notes:

Bats and Trees

If mature trees are likely to be affected by the works, (e.g. by felling or lopping work), it is important to survey these trees for the presence of bats, prior to works commencing. Bats and their 'roost' sites are fully protected under the 1981 Wildlife and Countryside Act and the Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2010, the latter of which deems them a European Protected Species. It is a criminal offence to recklessly disturb or destroy a known or suspected bat 'roost', even if the roost is only occasionally used. In considering planning applications that may affect European Protected Species, the Local Authority is bound by the Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2010 to have regard to the Habitats Directive when exercising their functions.

Breeding bird note

Work should avoid disturbance to nesting birds. Birds can nest in many places including buildings, trees, shrubs dense ivy, and bramble/rose scrub. Nesting birds are protected under the 1981 Wildlife and Countryside Act. The main nesting season, lasts approximately from March to September, so work should ideally take place outside these dates if at all possible. N.B birds can nest at any time, and the site should ideally be checked for their presence immediately before work starts, especially if during the breeding season.
